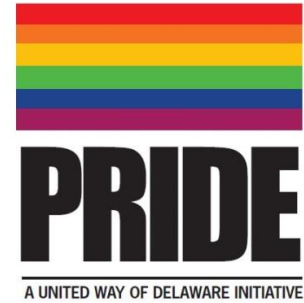
As an undergraduate at UD, Vicky was very active in the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Student Union serving as co-president for two years. She also served on the board of the North East Lesbian Gay Bisexual Student Union and co-chaired the annual conference which was held at UD in 1992. She did internships with the National Lesbian Gay Bisexual Task Force and the Human Rights Campaign. Vicky spoke to thousands of students and faculty through outreach programs at UD and beyond including spending several years presenting to the New Castle County Police as part of their diversity training.

In 1999, she helped start Lesbian Health Initiatives (LeHI), to educate the lesbian community in Delaware about breast cancer, safer sex and domestic violence issues. She began her involvement with DBCC as a volunteer helping with the start up of the Taking Care of Ourselves lesbian health program.
